LINDSAY-Two City of Kawartha Lakes osprey involved in a telemetry project with the Friends of the Osprey are currently on their way south.

Tagged as #95050 and #54706, the birds are currently in different areas of the continental United States, according to the data from Bird Studies Canada.

Terry Edick of the Friends of the Osprey, said osprey migration is usually dependent on the number of hours of sunlight during the day.

"It's just always been that way," Edick said.

As of Monday, Sept. 7, the bird tagged #95050 was located in northern Pennsylvania, after being in the Sturgeon Lake area for the prior few weeks.

The bird marked as #54706 started moving southward much earlier, and was in Pennsylvania by Sept. 1. According to the data, it is currently in South Carolina, almost in Georgia.

The birds usually follow a coastline when flying south, but Edick said there is no way of knowing where they are going from here.

"They may go west towards the Florida Panhandle, or to Cuba or Costa Rica, we don't really know," Edick said.

Edick said she is worried if the osprey were to head out towards Gulf states that have been affected by the oil spill.

Because osprey eat only fish, they could be in danger.

"It's impossible to know the impact of this,"

Edick said so far they are very happy with the telemetry project.

"We are going to get some very valuable data."

The product was made possible by fundraising, including donations from Shell Canada.

Overall, the project cost \$15,000. The Friends of the Osprey will have a booth providing information on their agency and telemetry project at the Lindsay Fair later this month. The group's FOTO contest is also wrapping up soon. The deadline is Sept. 14.
